

Code of Practice for Participants of Jealott's Hill Community Landshare (JHCL)

The mission statement for the Project is:

Using our passion to share the joy of practical horticulture, we recognise the power gardening has to enrich peoples' lives, especially those who have a disability or are disadvantaged.

Strategy

Our horticultural activities focus on food production, recreation and promoting environmental awareness by:

- *offering opportunities to learn how gardening and looking after the environment helps people.*
- *sharing what we do*
- *supporting and teaching individuals and organisations practical and creative ways to use gardening and sustain the environment.*
- *providing therapeutic activity and support applied to all participants and plot holders of Jealotts Hill Community Landshare.*
- *sharing produce*

This should be read in conjunction with Permission to Cultivate for participants who are members of a group using the site.

Participants:-

- (1) shall not cause any nuisance or annoyance to others, obstruct paths, roads or access for others.
- (2) are not authorised to speak publicly or use the JHCL name in any media communication without the permission of the Project Manager or the Bracknell Forest Homes Communications and Marketing Officer.
- (3) shall not cut or prune trees without permission of the Project Manager.
- (4) shall not take, sell or carry away earth, manure or materials of any kind from the site.
- (5) are not allowed to bring or keep tied any livestock or animal on the site. Due consideration will be given in certain circumstances by the project manager, for example hearing/guide dogs.
- (6) shall take away from the site all non-organic waste matter and not deposit rubbish within the JHCL site or that of its neighbours. Burning rubbish or lighting fires is not permitted.
- (7) when using pesticides, fungicides or herbicides participants must ensure they are kept securely. They must be used with due respect to other participants and in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations. All

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empty containers must be removed from site and under no circumstances be left, washed out or emptied at the JHCL site.

(8) shall park their car using the allocated parking area and have a vehicle on site for no other purpose. There is no permitted over night parking or leaving of vehicles, trailers, equipment or materials, nor vehicle repairs. There is no vehicle access to the Group growing areas at any time other than for individuals who require it using a recognised disability vehicle and with permission of the Project Manager.

(9) have no access to the Syngenta site at any time, unless authorised to do so. Participants are requested to close the gate behind them on arrival and to ensure closing and locking the gate on departure. To also close behind them the "crash barrier" gate if last to leave. Any contravention of this will result in the immediate suspension of the participant.

(10) are expected to use water responsibly and are not permitted to use or access any equipment, tools or materials, not of their ownership, without permission of the Project Manager.

(11) will at all times engage in safe working practices, respecting others who are on site and work in the true spirit of it being a fully inclusive Community Project.

(12) will need the permission of the Project Manager to engage in any activity on site other than cultivating produce.

(13) are prohibited to bring on to the site any material for disposal including green waste material for compost.

The Project Manager reserves the right to restrict access times to the site and implement security systems and checks.
